The Mental Health Department utilizes numerous therapy modalities including the psychodynamic, cognitive-behavioral, gestalt and interpersonal approaches. Clients receiving Mental Health services benefit from individual therapy, group therapy and family therapy. Specialty psychotherapy groups address clients' specific issues which contribute to addiction.
